SUSANVILLE CITY COUNCIL Regular Meeting Minutes November 16, 2016 – 6:00 p.m.

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Garnier.

Roll call of Councilmembers present: Brian Wilson, Kevin Stafford, Joe Franco, Rod De Boer and Kathie Garnier.

Staff present: Jared G. Hancock, City Administrator; Jessica Ryan, City Attorney and Gwenna MacDonald, City Clerk.

1 APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Motion by Councilmember De Boer, second by Mayor pro tem Franco, to approve the agenda as submitted; motion carried unanimously. Ayes: Wilson, Stafford, Franco, De Boer and Garnier.

2 PUBLIC COMMENT REGARDING CLOSED SESSION ITEMS:

Al Robbins thanked the City Council for considering his request for the City to take over the Wood Duck Court public access road and utility infrastructure. He developed the property and put in new sewer, water and road 12 years ago. There are two new fire hydrants in the system and the new road has been completely finished. He stated that he did not want to approach the Council before the project was completed, and he will also be approaching the Susanville Sanitary District and asking for them to assume responsibility for the sewer system. The project was completed based upon engineering designs and specifications, and the newly constructed home on the street has 90 pounds of water pressure and meets current sprinkler system requirements.

Mayor pro tem Franco asked if there was City water and natural gas in place.

Mr. Robbins responded that there was.

Councilmember Wilson asked why Mr. Robbins kept the road a private roadway when it was installed.

Mr. Robbins replied that he wanted to maintain control of the project, and not approach the City with an incomplete subdivision. He added that he has been a businessman for years and wanted to maintain control of the project.

Mayor pro tem Franco asked if the road was made public, if the City would then assume responsibility for its maintenance and upkeep.

Mr. Hancock confirmed that it would become the City's responsibility.

Councilmember Stafford complimented Mr. Robbins on the quality of the project.

Mayor Garnier informed the Council and Mr. Robbins that as a resident of Wood Duck Court, she would be recusing herself from the discussion regarding the item.

At 7:03 p.m. the City Council recessed Closed Session and RETURN TO OPEN SESSION: reconvened in Open Session.

Staff present: Jared G. Hancock, City Administrator; Jessica Ryan, City Attorney; Jim Uptegrove, Interim Police Chief; James Moore, Fire Chief; Dan Newton, Public Works Director; Deborah Savage, Finance Manager; and Gwenna MacDonald, City Clerk.

Mr. Hancock reported that prior to Closed Session the City Council approved the agenda as submitted. During Closed Session, the City Council gave direction, and took unanimous action to approve Item 3C1, approving MOU's with the Miscellaneous and Public Works bargaining units. The MOU's would be brought back at the next meeting for ratification in open session.

Councilmember Rod E. De Boer offered the Thought of the Day.

- **CONSENT CALENDAR**: Mayor Garnier reviewed the items on the Consent Calendar: 6

 - Approve vendor warrants numbered 98729 through 98833 for a total of \$347,102.28 R including \$112,534.85 in payroll warrants

Motion by Councilmember De Boer, second by Councilmember Stafford, to approve the Consent Calendar; motion carried unanimously. Ayes: Wilson, Stafford, Franco, De Boer and Garnier.

- **NEW BUSINESS:** 9

9A Consider appointment of Airport Commission members Mr. Hancock reported that the Airport Commission serves to advise and make recommendations to the City Council regarding activities at the Susanville Municipal Airport, and consists of five members who serve four year terms. Currently the terms of two Commissioners, Richard Hrezo and Larry Beck, expire on November 30th. The City has advertised the vacancies and received two letters of interest from Mr. Hrezo and Mr. Beck. The board members serve based upon the recommendation of the Mayor who has recommended Mr. Hrezo and Mr. Beck fill the vacancies that will end in November 2020.

There were no questions or comments from the City Council.

Motion by Councilmember De Boer, second by Mayor pro tem Franco, to approve the appointment of Larry Beck and Richard Hrezo to the Susanville Airport Commission as recommended; motion carried unanimously. Ayes: Wilson, Stafford, Franco, De Boer and Garnier.

9B Consider proposed update to the Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP) Mr. Hancock explained that as part of the process to maintain eligibility for funding provided through the FAA, the City conducts a periodic review of the Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP). In order to address changes in project schedules and update the document with projects anticipated to occur in future funding years, the City met with the FAA and based on those discussions, has prepared an updated ACIP. The Plan was reviewed by the Airport Commission and discussed at length, and staff received valuable feedback from those discussions. The Commission recommended that the City Council approve the proposed update.

Mayor pro tem Franco stated that the City has discussed plumbing the water from the Johnstonville water tank, and he asked if that project was included in the ACIP.

Mr. Hancock responded that it was not. The ACIP projects are those that would be completed based upon leveraging FAA funds, and the FAA has a lengthy set of guidelines and criteria that establishes the eligibility of projects, and water infrastructure projects are not normally funded. It is likely that grant funding would be a more appropriate avenue for funding and it does not always require a city match.

Mayor pro tem Franco commented that the City has also discussed lengthening the runway in order to accommodate larger aircraft, and asked if that project was included.

Mr. Hancock responded that it was discussed by the Airport Commission and they expressed some interest, and it would be evaluated as part of the Airport Layout Plan update. There is one project for property acquisition to re-align a fence along the main taxiway. The process to acquire property through purchase with FAA dollars is rigorous and triggers a significant number of environmental studies and other requirements that gets very expensive. Before the City completes the Airport Land Use Plan narrative in 2018 it will have to make a final decision regarding the inclusion of a runway expansion project.

Mayor Garnier asked if the \$90,000 referenced in the ACIP for expansion was for land acquisition only.

Mr. Hancock stated that it was inclusive of costs related to appraisals and meeting environmental review requirements in addition to the actual purchase of the property.

Councilmember Wilson asked if the Airport Commission had discussed the funding that the City sets aside each year from the General Fund to provide the ten percent match for the entitlement money that the

FAA provides. The list of projects on the ACIP is significantly greater than the \$150,000 that the City receives annually, and he expressed concern that the Airport Commission has a different vision than the City Council in terms of the future growth and expansion of the Airport.

Mr. Hancock responded that the Airport Commission has discussed that subject at great length, and it was a key factor in the decision to establish new lease rates for commercial users as well as upgrade the language in the private leases. They have discussed project funding and were unanimous in the sentiment that the project funding has to come from the highest users of the facility and by increasing economic activity. These discussions will be ongoing and the City will continue to explore cost saving opportunities through in-kind services such as project inspections provided by the City engineering department. Mr. Hancock added that the Airport Commission tabled discussion of the draft lease until further consideration, as they recognize that it has to be an integral part of the overall business plan.

Mayor pro tem Franco asked if the ACIP was approved if it was a document that was subject to adjustments as future plans change or funding opportunities become available.

Mr. Hancock explained that the plan gives the FAA an indication of where the City is headed in the next several years, and the future of non-entitlement funding is uncertain. The City receives \$150,000 annually as was mentioned, but the FAA has additional funding sources that are not as reliable, so it is important that the City provides a map of future plans and projects so that as additional funding becomes available, it could potentially be dedicated towards completion of those projects. In addition, the likelihood of also securing the Caltrans match, which is four and one half percent, is greater if the projects are listed in the ACIP, as the Caltrans match has become increasingly more difficult to obtain.

Councilmember Wilson asked how much money has accumulated in the annual entitlement funding allocation.

Mr. Hancock responded that the City has \$220,000 available through prior year carry over, and \$180,000 has been budgeted for completion of the PAPI project which is anticipated to be completed in the spring of 2017.

Motion by Councilmember Wilson, second by Councilmember Stafford, to approve the updated 2018-2022 Airport Capital Improvement Plan and authorize submittal to the FAA; motion carried unanimously. Ayes: Wilson, Stafford, Franco, De Boer and Garnier.

9C Consider Resolution No. 16-5338 increasing the bail schedule (fines) for parking violation within the City of Susanville along with the delinquency fee for late or non-payment Interim Chief Uptegrove explained the process and authority that allows the City to establish fines for parking violations within the City. These fines also include delinquency fees for late or non-payment of the fines. The City's current scheduling for parking violation fines was established in 1997 and staff is recommending that the penalties be increased to be more consistent with what other municipalities are charging. He reviewed the proposed schedule, noting that most parking violations would be increased by \$5.00 and adding a \$2.00 City surcharge. A State surcharge of \$12.50 is required to be added to all violations.

Chief Uptegrove reviewed the delinquency fees and disabled parking violations. He commended Community Services Officer Cody Loflin for his research and work on updating the schedule.

Mr. Loflin offered to answer any questions that the City Council might have regarding the report.

Mayor Garnier asked what the base fine is for violating the handicapped parking regulation, and how the fines compare with other jurisdictions.

Mr. Loflin stated that the base fine is \$275.00 and the fines are on the lower end from what is seen in other cities.

Mayor pro tem Franco recognized that the City does not have the staffing for a fully dedicated officer to deal with just parking and traffic issues, and asked if the violations for handicapped parking were initiated on a complaint basis.

Chief Uptegrove responded that for the most part citations are issued based upon reports or complaints of violations. Staff recognizes that the fees are still some of the lowest among the comparable cities and is recommending that the increase be reasonable given the length of time that the existing fines have been in place.

Motion by Councilmember De Boer, second by Councilmember Stafford, to approve Resolution No. 16-5338; motion carried unanimously. Ayes: Wilson, Stafford, Franco, De Boer and Garnier.

12 **CONTINUING BUSINESS**:

Consider Ordinance No. 16-1006 amending Section 6.08.070, of the Susanville Municipal Code increasing fees for impounds of animals and daily care: Waive first reading and introduce Mr. Hancock reported that at the City Council had previously considered an amendment to the fees charged for the daily care of dogs that are impounded or quarantined at the Lassen County Animal Shelter. Ordinance 16-1006 has been prepared to amend Section 6.08.070 of the Susanville Municipal Code to implement the fee increase. Impound fees will be \$50.00 for the first impound plus a \$12.00 daily care fee that is charged for every day or fraction of the day that the dog is kept. If the dog is impounded a second time the fee is increased to \$100.00 and \$200.00 for the third and each subsequent impound. If the dog is not impounded at all for a period of 12 months from the most recent impoundment, then the fee will return to \$50.00 as if it were the first impound. Animals, canine or feline, that are subject to quarantine for bites and do not have proof of a current rabies vaccination or that do not meet the conditions of a home quarantine, will be assessed a \$50.00 to \$200.00 impound fee based on the number of violations and impound schedule plus a \$20.00 per day maintenance fee, for each day or fraction thereof the animal is kept. For impounded animals with no registered owner on record, a notice of impoundment will be posted at City Hall and the Police Department for a period of three days. The city is also looking at having that listed on the City's website as well.

Motion by Councilmember De Boer, second by Mayor pro tem Franco, to waive the first reading and introduce Ordinance No. 16-1006; motion carried unanimously. Ayes: Wilson, Stafford, Franco, De Boer and Garnier.

Councilmember Wilson asked for an update regarding the status of the agreement with Lassen County for operation of the animal shelter.

Mr. Hancock explained that the agreement was entered into between Lassen County and the City, with the City owning the land and the County handling the daily budgeting and operations for the facility. He explained the process for revenue collection and distribution, with the City allocation being forty percent and the County sixty percent. The fees collected per Ordinance No. 16-1006 offset the amount that the City pays to the County for operation of the shelter. Staff has been working to update the agreement and would be bringing that to City Council for consideration at a future date.

Cooperative (CO-OP) Agreement with Caltrans for the Susanville Southeast Gateway Project, Project No. 02-1200-0097 Mr. Hancock reported that the City has a current cooperative agreement with Caltrans for the Susanville Southeast Gateway Project, however Caltrans has requested a revision to the payment provision in the contract. It is a somewhat time sensitive item, as the City would like to be reimbursed for the invoices that have been incurred under the R.E.Y. Engineers contract. Mr. Hancock explained that the Southeast Gateway Project for the City is to enhance the southeast entrance to the City by installing enhancements including new curb, gutter and sidewalk, ADA compliant ramps, pedestrian and intersection lighting. The improvements are goals that have been identified in the Susanville Gateway Project and are anticipated to provide new pedestrian pathways connecting the southeast shopping areas with other existing commercial areas. The project will also include shoulder widening of State Route 36.

The project is currently in the Project Approval and Environmental Determination (PA&ED) phase with the consultant, R.E.Y. Engineers, Inc. that the City Council authorized in March 2016. The scope includes performing technical studies, preliminary engineering and completing environmental compliance documents. As a federally funded project, these are all required components to develop the project for final design and construction and to meet all Caltrans and Federal Highway Administration criteria. The City's Co-op Agreement with Caltrans was originally entered into in November 5, 2014 and the amended agreement is similar in many aspects, and the need for the amendment is to add the payment language that from the State's perspective are standard language requirements used in their co-op agreements with local agencies.

Mayor pro tem Franco noted that the agreement references both CEQA and NEPA, and asked why it includes both levels of review.

Mr. Hancock responded that the project is utilizing Federal funding, so it triggers the Federal-level NEPA review as part of the environmental process.

Councilmember Wilson asked if the proposed design included the changes in front of Jack in the Box that had been previously discussed.

Mr. Hancock stated that the section of street in front of Jack in the Box is something that staff is working on with Caltrans. The project is still in the PA&ED phase, with environmental studies being a key focus. This portion of the project was budgeted a few years ago based upon the level of environmental review that was expected at that time. When Caltrans was working on the Cap M project, they identified past documentation that noted some type of historical site at that corner. There is not a complete resolution to that issue yet, as originally it was included in the Cap M project, and now they are discussing having the City work on that corner as part of the Southeast Gateway Project, and expanding the environmental scope to be as broad as possible which is going to result in a higher budgeted amount to complete the work. Staff is continuing discussions with Caltrans management to define the scope and requirements

based upon the original required analysis or an increase to the project budget in order to cover those additional costs.

Mayor pro tem Franco stated that there were already improvements at that corner so there was nothing that could be done to remediate that.

Mr. Hancock stated that the Caltrans Cap M project was simply the addition of ADA ramps, and the Southeast Gateway project is more substantial, with connectivity paths to ADA ramps along the street side of Jack in the Box as well as along the parking lot to the walking bridge that leads into the Safeway parking lot.

Mayor Garnier asked why that issue did not come up when Jack in the Box was put in.

Mr. Hancock responded that it may have, and it is likely that someone was on site conducting inspections throughout the construction process.

Councilmember Wilson asked if the project was still in the design phase and when construction was anticipated to being.

Mr. Hancock replied that it was still in the design phase and there was a general discussion regarding possible funding sources for construction and he noted that this project is still seen as a Caltrans project because it is on a state highway. This is helpful in that it provides additional opportunities for funding that are available to Caltrans that would not be available to the City.

Motion by Councilmember De Boer, second by Mayor pro tem Franco, to approve Resolution No. 16-5337; motion carried unanimously. Ayes: Wilson, Stafford, Franco, De Boer and Garnier.

13 CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORTS:

Bizz Johnson Senior Fall Color Tour Mr. Hancock provided an update to the City Council regarding the annual Bizz Johnson Trail tour conducted by the Bureau of Land Management for senior citizens. With the use of golf carts provided by the City's Diamond Mountain Golf Course, residents of Lassen Nursing Rehabilitation Center and the Eagle Lake Village Senior Living Center are transported up the trail to view the autumn foliage. BLM staff have expressed their appreciation to the City for supporting this very popular event.

SUBJECT: Ordinance No. 16-1008 rezoning Assessor's Parcel Number 105-130-06 from R-1 to R-3 - Standiford General Plan Amendment and Rezone File GZ 15-018

PRESENTED BY: Craig Sanders, City Planner

SUMMARY: This project involves a proposed amendment to the City of Susanville General Plan Land Use Element map to change the land use designation and zoning of a 2 acre parcel from Single Family Residential with an R-1 zoning to a designation of Duplex and Triplex Residential with an R-3 zoning. The site is located at 460 Russell Avenue and is currently developed with a single family dwelling which the applicant is planning to convert into a triplex.

The City Council held a public hearing for this item on December 7, 2016 and voted to waive the first reading of the ordinance and approved Resolution No. 16-5290 changing the land use designation from Single Family Residential to Duplex and Triplex Residential subject to the approval of the second reading of the Ordinance. The public hearing on this item has been closed and may not be reopened unless new public notice has been given.

Approval of the ordinance would rezone the property allowing the site to be developed with up to 15 dwelling units per acre (30 units total). The Planning Commission in Architectural and Site Plan Review/Use Permit UA16-007 adopted a design for 30 units to be constructed over a 6 year time frame in 5 phases as referenced by Resolution No. 16-1043.

FISCAL IMPACT: None at this time.

ACTION REQUESTED: Motion to waive the second reading and approve Ordinance No. 16-1008 approving zone change number GZ-15-018 for Larry Standiford Project amending the Zoning Map for the City of Susanville.

A. This contract is between the following named, hereinafter referred to as, CONSULTANT and the following named, hereinafter referred to as, LOCAL AGENCY:

- B. The work to be performed under this contract is described in Article II entitled Statement of Work and the approved CONSULTANT's Cost Proposal dated March 10, 2016. The approved CONSULTANT's Cost Proposal is attached hereto (Attachment B) and incorporated by reference. If there is any conflict between the approvedCost Proposal and this contract, this contract shall take precedence.
- C. CONSULTANT agrees to indemnify and hold harmless LOCAL AGENCY, its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, demands, costs, or liability arising from or connected with the services provided hereunder due to negligent acts, errors, or omissions of CONSULTANT. CONSULTANT will reimburse LOCAL AGENCY for any expenditure, including reasonable attorney fees, incurred by LOCAL AGENCY in defending against claims ultimately determined to be due to negligent acts, errors, or omissions of CONSULTANT.
- D. CONSULTANT and the agents and employees of CONSULTANT, in the performance of this contract, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of LOCAL AGENCY.
- E. Without the written consent of LOCAL AGENCY, this contract is not assignable by CONSULTANT either in whole or in part.
- F. No alteration or variation of the terms of this contract shall be valid, unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto; and no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein, shall be binding on any of the parties hereto.
- G. The consideration to be paid to CONSULTANT as provided herein, shall be in compensation for all of CONSULTANT's expenses incurred in the performance hereof, including travel and per diem, unless otherwise expressly so provided.

ARTICLE II STATEMENT OF WORK

Scope of Services are outlined in Request for Proposals (Attachment A, Section 5).

A. Consultant Services

The CONSULTANT shall develop an approach to the scope of work outlined in the Request for Proposals (Attachment A). The work shall be performed in accordance with the guidelines established by Caltrans and the Federal Highway Administration, including the Standard Environmental Reference, Local Assistance Procedures Manual, Project Development Procedures Manual, Highway Design Manual, Highway Capacity

Manual and other required or accepted documents. Environmental documents are not considered complete until signed by appropriate Caltrans official.

B. Right of Way

Right of Way requirements are to be determined and shown by CONSULTANT, This includes sufficient right of way investigations to determine the extent of right of way needs for the programming purposes. See Attachment A, Section 5, 3.1.

C. Surveys

Construction Surveys will not be required. See Attachment A, Section 5, 3.1.

D. Subsurface Investigations

It is not anticipated that subsurface investigations will be required by the CONSULTANT. However, should the CONSULTANT recommend otherwise based on their findings and in accordance with the Standard Environmental Reference, a contract amendment will be created to address the additional scope of work. See Attachment A, Section 5, 4.

E. Local Agency Obligations

Applicable data to the project is available to CONSULTANT in Attachment A.

F. Conferences, Visits to Site, Inspection of Work

CONSULTANT shall hold regular meetings with the LOCAL AGENCY to discuss tasks, schedule and coordination efforts. CONSULTANT shall submit monthly progress reports with invoices defining work that was completed during the month as well as anticipated upcoming tasks. Report shall also include updated project milestones and critical path targets. Should modifications be needed for milestones or critical path, explanation should be included in the monthly report. Costs incurred by CONSULTANT for meetings, subsequent to the initial meeting shall be included in the fee. See Attachment A, Section 5, 1.4.

G. Consultant Services During Construction

No construction drawings will be prepared by the CONSULTANT during the course of this contract.

H. Documentation and Schedules

CONSULTANT will document the results of the work to the satisfaction of LOCAL AGENCY, and the State and FHWA. See Attachment A, Section 5, 1.4 and 1.6.

I. Deliverables and Number of Copies

All deliverables shall include 3 hard copies and 1 electronic copy. See Attachment A, Section 5.

ARTICLE III CONSULTANT'S REPORTS OR MEETINGS

- A. CONSULTANT shall submit progress reports at least once a month. The report should be sufficiently detailed for the Contract Administrator to determine, if CONSULTANT is performing to expectations, or is on schedule; to provide communication of interim findings, and to sufficiently address any difficulties or special problems encountered, so remedies can be developed.
- B. CONSULTANT's Project Manager shall meet with LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator, as needed, to discuss progress on the contract.

ARTICLE IV PERFORMANCE PERIOD

A. This contract shall go into effect on March 16, 2016, contingent upon approval by LOCAL AGENCY, and CONSULTANT shall commence work after notification to proceed by LOCAL AGENCY'S Contract Administrator. The contract shall end on December 31, 2016, unless extended

by contract amendment,

B. CONSULTANT is advised that any recommendation for contract award is not binding on LOCAL AGENCY until the contract is fully executed and approved by LOCAL AGENCY.

ARTICLE V ALLOWABLE COSTS AND PAYMENTS

- A. The method of payment for this contract will be based on actual cost plus a fixed fee. LOCAL AGENCY will reimburse CONSULTANT for actual costs (including labor costs, employee benefits, travel, equipment rental costs, overhead and other direct costs) incurred by CONSULTANT in performance of the work CONSULTANT will not be reimbursed for actual costs that exceed the estimated wage rates, employee benefits, travel, equipment rental, overhead, and other estimated costs set forth in the approved CONSULTANT'S Cost Proposal, unless additional reimbursement is provided for by contract amendment. In no event, will CONSULTANT be reimbursed for overhead costs at a rate that exceeds LOCAL AGENCY's approved overhead rate set forth in the Cost Proposal. In the event, that LOCAL AGENCY determines that a change to the work from that specified in the Cost Proposal and contract is required, the contract time or actual costs reimbursable by LOCAL AGENCY shall be adjusted by contract amendment to accommodate the changed work. The maximum total cost as specified in Paragraph "H" shall not be exceeded, unless authorized by contract amendment.
- B. In addition to the allowable incurred costs, LOCAL AGENCY will pay CONSULTANT a fixed fee of \$128,865.00. The fixed fee is nonadjustable for the term of the contract, except in the event of a significant change in the scope of work and such adjustment is made by contract amendment.
- C. Reimbursement for transportation and subsistence costs shall not exceed the rates specified in the approved Cost Proposal (Attachment B).
- D. When milestone cost estimates are included in the approved Cost Proposal, CONSULTANT shall obtain prior written approval for a revised milestone cost estimate from the Contract Administrator before exceeding such cost estimate.
- E. Progress payments will be made monthly in arrears based on services provided and allowable incurred costs. A pro rata portion of CONSULTANT's fixed fee will be included in the monthly progress payments. If CONSULTANT fails to submit the required deliverable items according to the schedule set forth in the Statement of Work, LOCAL AGENCY shall have the right to delay payment or terminate this Contract in accordance with the provisions of Article VI Termination.
- F. No payment will be made prior to approval of any work, nor for any work performed prior to approval of this contract.
- G. CONSULTANT will be reimbursed, as promptly as fiscal procedures will permit upon receipt by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator of itemized invoices in triplicate. Invoices shall be submitted no later than 45 calendar days after the performance of work for which CONSULTANT is billing. Invoices shall detail the work performed on each milestone and each project as applicable. Invoices shall follow the format stipulated for the approved Cost Proposal and shall reference this contract number and project title. H. The total amount payable by LOCAL AGENCY including the fixed fee shall not exceed \$128,865.00.

- I. Salary increases will be reimbursable if the new salary is within the salary range identified in the approved Cost Proposal and is approved by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator.
 - For personnel subject to prevailing wage rates as described in the California Labor Code, all salary increases, which are the direct result of changes in the prevailing wage rates are reimbursable.
- J. All subcontracts in excess of \$25,000 shall contain the above provisions.

ARTICLE VI TERMINATION

- A. LOCAL AGENCY reserves the right to terminate this contract upon thirty (30) calendar days written notice to CONSULTANT with the reasons for termination stated in the notice.
- B. LOCAL AGENCY may terminate this contract with CONSULTANT should CONSULTANT fail to perform the covenants herein contained at the time and in the manner herein provided. In the event of such termination, LOCAL AGENCY may proceed with the work in any manner deemed proper by LOCAL AGENCY. If LOCAL AGENCY terminates this contract with CONSULTANT, LOCAL AGENCY shall pay CONSULTANT the sum due to CONSULTANT under this contract prior to termination, unless the cost of completion to LOCAL AGENCY exceeds the funds remaining in the contract. ARTICLE VII COST PRINCIPLES AND ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

- A. CONSULTANT agrees that the Contract Cost Principles and Procedures, 48 CFR, Federal Acquisition Regulations System, Chapter 1, Part 31.000 et seq., shall be used to determine the cost allowability of individual items.
- B. CONSULTANT also agrees to comply with federal procedures in accordance with 49 CFR, Part 18, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments.
- C. Any costs for which payment has been made to CONSULTANT that are determined by subsequent audit to be unallowable under 49 CFR, Part 18 and 48 CFR, Federal Acquisition Regulations System, Chapter 1, Part 31.000 et seq., are subject to repayment by CONSULTANT to LOCAL AGENCY.
- D. All subcontracts in excess of \$25,000 shall contain the above provisions.

ARTICLE VIII RETENTION OF RECORDS/AUDIT

For the purpose of determining compliance with Public Contract Code 10115, et seq. and Title 21, California Code of Regulations, Chapter 21, Section 2500 et seq., when applicable and other matters connected with the performance of the contract pursuant to Government Code 8546.7; CONSULTANT, subconsultants, and LOCAL AGENCY shall maintain and make available for inspection all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to the performance of the contract, including but not limited to, the costs of administering the contract. All parties shall make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times during the contract period and for three years from the date of final payment under the contract. The state, State Auditor, LOCAL AGENCY, FHWA, or any duly authorized representative of the Federal Government shall have access to any books, records, and documents of CONSULTANT and it's certified public accountants (CPA) work papers that are pertinent to the contract and indirect cost rates (ICR) for audit, examinations, excerpts, and transactions, and copies thereof shall be furnished if requested. Subcontracts in excess of \$25,000 shall contain this provision.

- A. Any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under an interim or post audit of this contract that is not disposed of by agreement, shall be reviewed by LOCAL AGENCY'S Chief Financial Officer.
- B. Not later than 30 days after issuance of the final audit report, CONSULTANT may request a review by LOCAL AGENCY'S Chief Financial Officer of unresolved audit issues. The request for review will be submitted in writing.
- C. Neither the pendency of a dispute nor its consideration by LOCAL AGENCY will excuse CONSULTANT from full and timely performance, in accordance with the terms of this contract.

ARTICLE X SUBCONTRACTING

- A. Nothing contained in this contract or otherwise, shall create any contractual relation between LOCAL AGENCY and any subconsultant(s), and no subcontract shall relieve CONSULTANT of its responsibilities and obligations hereunder. CONSULTANT agrees to be as fully responsible to LOCAL AGENCY for the acts and omissions of its subconsultant(s) and of persons either directly or indirectly employed by any ofthem as it is for the acts and omissions of persons directly employed by CONSULTANT. CONSULTANT's obligation to pay its subconsultant(s) is an independent obligation from LOCAL AGENCY'S obligation to make payments to the CONSULTANT.
- B. CONSULTANT shall perform the work contemplated with resources available within its own organization and no portion of the work pertinent to this contract shall be subcontracted without written authorization by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator, except that, which is expressly identified in the approved Cost Proposal.
- C. CONSULTANT shall pay its subconsultants within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of each payment made to CONSULTANT by LOCAL AGENCY.
- D. Any subcontract in excess of \$25,000 entered into as a result of this contract shall contain all the provisions stipulated in this contract to be applicable to subconsultants.
- E. Any substitution of subconsultant(s) must be approved in writing by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator prior to the start of work by the subconsultant(s).

ARTICLE XI EQUIPMENT PURCHASE

- A. Prior authorization in writing, by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator shall be required before CONSULTANT enters into any unbudgeted purchase order, or subcontract exceeding \$5,000 for supplies, equipment, or CONSULTANT services. CONSULTANT shall provide an evaluation of the necessity or desirability of incurring such costs.
- B. For purchase of any item, service or consulting work not covered in CONSULTANT's Cost Proposal and exceeding \$5,000 prior authorization by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator; three competitive quotations must be submitted with the request, or the absence of bidding must be adequately justified.
- C. Any equipment purchased as a result of this contract is subject to the following: "CONSULTANT shall maintain an inventory of all nonexpendable property. Nonexpendable property is defined as having a useful life of at least two years and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more. If the purchased equipment needs replacement and is sold or traded in, LOCAL AGENCY shall receive a proper refund or credit at the conclusion of the contract, or if the contract is terminated, CONSULTANT may either keep the equipment and credit LOCAL AGENCY in an amount equal to its fair market value, or sell such equipment at the best price obtainable at a public or private sale, in accordance with established LOCAL AGENCY procedures; and credit LOCAL AGENCY in an amount equal to the sales price. If CONSULTANT elects to keep the equipment, fair market value shall be determined at CONSULTANT's expense, on the basis of a competent independent appraisal of such equipment. Appraisals shall be obtained from an appraiser mutually agreeable to by LOCAL AGENCY and CONSULTANT, if it is determined to sell the equipment, the terms and

conditions of such sale must be approved in advance by LOCAL AGENCY." 49 CFR, Part 18 requires a credit to Federal funds when participating equipment with a fair market value greater than \$5,000 is credited to the project.

D. All subcontracts in excess \$25,000 shall contain the above provisions.

ARTICLE XII STATE PREVAILING WAGE RATES

- A. CONSULTANT shall comply with the State of California's General Prevailing Wage Rate requirements in accordance with California Labor Code, Section 1770, and all Federal, State, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work.
- B. Any subcontract entered into as a result of this contract, if for more than \$25,000 for public works construction or more than \$15,000 for the alteration, demolition, repair, or maintenance of public works, shall contain all of the provisions of this Article.
- C. When prevailing wages apply to the services described in the scope of work, transportation and subsistence costs shall be reimbursed at the minimum rates set by the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) as outlined in the applicable Prevailing Wage Determination. See: http://www.dir.ca.gov.

ARTICLE XIII CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A. CONSULTANT shall disclose any financial, business, or other relationship with LOCAL AGENCY that may have an impact upon the outcome of this contract, or any ensuing LOCAL AGENCY construction project. CONSULTANT shall also list current clients who may have a financial interest in the outcome of this contract, or any ensuing LOCAL AGENCY construction project, which will follow.
- B. CONSULTANT hereby certifies that it does not now have, nor shall it acquire any financial or business interest that would conflict with the performance of services under this contract.
- C. Any subcontract in excess of \$25,000 entered into as a result of this contract, shall contain all of the provisions of this Article.
- D. CONSULTANT hereby certifies that neither CONSULTANT, nor any firm affiliated with CONSULTANT will bid on any construction contract, or on any contract to provide construction inspection for any construction project resulting from this contract. An affiliated firm is one, which is subject to the control of the same persons through joint-ownership, or otherwise.
- E. Except for subconsultants whose services are limited to providing surveying or materials testing information, no subconsultant who has provided design services in connection with this contract shall be eligible to bid on any construction contract, or on any contract to provide construction inspection for any construction project resulting from this contract.

ARTICLE XIV REBATES, KICKBACKS OR OTHER UNLAWFUL CONSIDERATION

CONSULTANT warrants that this contract was not obtained or secured through rebates kickbacks or other unlawful consideration, either promised or paid to any LOCAL AGENCY employee. For breach or violation of this warranty, LOCAL AGENCY shall have the right in its discretion; to terminate the contract without liability; to pay only for the value of the work actually performed; or to deduct from the contract price; or otherwise recover the full amount of such rebate, kickback or other unlawful consideration.

ARTICLE XVI STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

A. CONSULTANT's signature affixed herein, and dated, shall constitute a certification under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that CONSULTANT has, unless exempt, complied with, the nondiscrimination program requirements of Government Code Section 12990 and Title 2, California

Administrative Code, Section 8103.

- B. During the performance of this Contract, Consultant and its subconsultants shall not unlawfully discriminate, harass, or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), mental disability, medical condition (e.g., cancer), age (over 40), marital status, and denial of family care leave. Consultant and subconsultants shall insure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment. Consultant and subconsultants shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Gov. Code §12990 (a-f) et seq.) and the applicable regulations promulgated there under (California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 7285 et seq.). The applicable regulations of the Fair Employment and Housing Commission implementing Government Code Section 12990 (a-f), set forth in Chapter 5 of Division 4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations, are incorporated into this Contract by reference and made a part hereof as if set forth in full. Consultant and its subconsultants shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other Agreement.
- C. The Consultant shall comply with regulations relative to Title VI (nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21 Effectuation of Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act). Title VI provides that the recipients of federal assistance will implement and maintain a policy of nondiscrimination in which no person in the state of California shall, on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, disability, be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of or subject to discrimination under any program or activity by the recipients of federal assistance or their assignees and successors in interest.
- D. The Consultant, with regard to the work performed by it during the Agreement shall act in accordance with Title VI. Specifically, the Consultant shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, or disability in the selection and retention of Subconsultants, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment. The Consultant shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the U.S. DOT's Regulations, including employment practices when the Agreement covers a program whose goal is employment.

ARTICLE XVII DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION CERTIFICATION

- A. CONSULTANT's signature affixed herein, shall constitute a certification under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California, that CONSULTANT has complied with Title 2 CFR, Part 180, "OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Government wide Debarment and Suspension (nonprocurement)", which certifies that he/she or any person associated therewith in the capacity of owner, partner, director, officer, or manager, is not currently under suspension, debarment, voluntary exclusion, or determination of ineligibility by any federal agency; has not been suspended, debarred, voluntarily excluded, or determined ineligible by any federal agency within the past three (3) years; does not have a proposed debarment pending; and has not been indicted, convicted, or had a civil judgment rendered against it by a court of competent jurisdiction in any matter involving fraud or official misconduct within the past three (3) years. Any exceptions to this certification must be disclosed to LOCAL AGENCY.
- B. Exceptions will not necessarily result in denial of recommendation for award, but will be considered in determining CONSULTANT responsibility. Disclosures must indicate to whom exceptions apply, initiating agency, and dates of action.
- C. Exceptions to the Federal Government Excluded Parties List System maintained by the General Services Administration are to be determined by the Federal highway Administration.

ARTICLE XVIII FUNDING REQUIREMENTS

A. It is mutually understood between the parties that this contract may have been written before ascertaining the availability of funds or appropriation of funds, for the mutual benefit of both parties, in order to avoid

- program and fiscal delays that would occur if the contract were executed after that determination was made.
- B. This contract is valid and enforceable only, if sufficient funds are made available to LOCAL AGENCY for the purpose of this contract. In addition, this contract is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations, conditions, or any statute enacted by the Congress, State Legislature, or LOCAL AGENCY governing board that may affect the provisions, terms, or funding of this contract in any manner.
- C. It is mutually agreed that if sufficient funds are not appropriated, this contract may be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.
- D. LOCAL AGENCY has the option to void the contract under the 30-day termination clause pursuant to Article VI, or by mutual agreement to amend the contract to reflect any reduction of funds.

ARTICLE XIX CHANGE IN TERMS

- A. This contract may be amended or modified only by mutual written agreement of the parties.
- B. CONSULTANT shall only commence work covered by an amendment after the amendment is executed and notification to proceed has been provided by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator.
- C. There shall be no change in CONSULTANT's Project Manager or members of the project team, as listed in the approved Cost Proposal, which is a part of this contract without prior written approval by LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator.

ARTICLE XX DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (DBE) PARTICIPATION

- A. This contract is subject to 49 CFR, Part 26 entitled "Participation by Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in Department of Transportation Financial Assistance Programs". Consultants who obtain DBE participation on this contract will assist Caltrans in meeting its federally mandated statewide overall DBE goal.
- B. The goal for DBE participation for this contract is 12%. Participation by DBE consultant or subconsultants shall be in accordance with information contained in the Consultant Proposal DBE Commitment (Exhibit 10-O1), or in the Consultant Contract DBE Information (Exhibit 10-O2) attached hereto and incorporated as part of the Contract. If a DBE subconsultant is unable to perform, CONSULTANT must make a good faith effort to replace him/her with another DBE subconsultant, if the goal is not otherwise met.
- C. DBEs and other small businesses, as defined in 49 CFR, Part 26 are encouraged to participate in the performance of contracts financed in whole or in part with federal funds. CONSULTANT or subconsultant shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. CONSULTANT shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR, Part 26 in the award and administration of US DOT-assisted agreements. Failure by CONSULTANT to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as LOCAL AGENCY deems appropriate.
- D. Any subcontract entered into as a result of this contract shall contain all of the provisions of this section.
- E. A DBE firm may be terminated only with prior written approval from LOCAL AGENCY and only for the reasons specified in 49 CFR 26.53(f). Prior to requesting LOCAL AGENCY consent for the termination, CONSULTANT must meet the procedural requirements specified in 49 CFR 26.53(f).
- F. A DBE performs a Commercially Useful Function (CUF) when it is responsible for execution of the work of the contract and is carrying out its responsibilities by actually performing, managing, and supervising the work involved. To perform a CUF, the DBE must also be responsible with respect to materials and supplies used on the contract, for negotiating price, determining quality and quantity, ordering the material, and installing (where applicable) and paying for the material itself. To determine whether a DBE is performing a CUF, evaluate the amount of work subcontracted, industry practices, whether the amount the firm is to be paid under the, contract is commensurate with the work it is actually performing, and other relevant factors.
- G. A DBE does not perform a CUF if its role is limited to that of an extra participant in a transaction, contract, or

- project through which funds are passed in order to obtain the appearance of DBE participation. In determining whether a DBE is such an extra participant, examine similar transactions, particularly those in which DBEs do not participate.
- H. If a DBE does not perform or exercise responsibility for at least thirty percent (30%) of the total cost of its contract with its own work force, or the DBE subcontracts a greater portion of the work of the contract than would be expected on the basis of normal industry practice for the type of work involved, it will be presumed that it is not performing a CUF.
- I. CONSULTANT shall maintain records of materials purchased or supplied from all subcontracts entered into with certified DBEs. The records shall show the name and business address of each DBE or vendor and the total dollar amount actually paid each DBE or vendor, regardless of tier. The records shall show the date of payment and the total dollar figure paid to all firms. DBE prime consultants shall also show the date of work performed by their own forces along with the corresponding dollar value of the work.
- J. Upon completion of the Contract, a summary of these records shall be prepared and submitted on the form entitled, "Final Report-Utilization of Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), First-Tier Subconsultants" CEM-2402F [Exhibit 17-F, of the LAPM], certified correct by CONSULTANT or CONSULTANT's authorized representative and shall be furnished to the Contract Administrator with the final invoice. Failure to provide the summary of DBE payments with the final invoice will result in twenty-five percent (25%) of the dollar value of the invoice being withheld from payment until the form is submitted. The amount will be returned to CONSULTANT when a satisfactory "Final Report-Utilization of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE), First-Tier Subconsultants" is submitted to the Contract Administrator.
- K. If a DBE subconsultant is decertified during the life of the contract, the decertified subconsultant shall notify CONSULTANT in writing with the date of decertification. If a subconsultant becomes a certified DBE during the life of the Contract, the subconsultant shall notify CONSULTANT in writing with the date of certification. Any changes should be reported to LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator within 30 days.

ARTICLE XXI CONTINGENT FEE

CONSULTANT warrants, by execution of this contract that no person or selling agency has been employed, or retained, to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding, for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees, or bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by CONSULTANT for the purpose of securing business. For breach or violation of this warranty, LOCAL AGENCY has the right to annul this contract without liability; pay only for the value of the work actually performed, or in its discretion to deduct from the contract price or consideration, or otherwise recover the full amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee.

ARTICLE XXII DISPUTES

- A. Any dispute, other than audit, concerning a question of fact arising under this contract that is not disposed of by agreement shall be decided by a committee consisting of LOCAL AGENCY's Contract Administrator: Jared Hancock, City Administrator and the Director of Public Works or as assigned by the City Council, who may consider written or verbal information submitted by CONSULTANT.
- B. Not later than 30 days after completion of all deliverables necessary to complete the plans, specifications and estimate, CONSULTANT may request review by LOCAL AGENCY Governing Board of unresolved claims or disputes, other than audit. The request for review will be submitted in writing.
- C. Neither the pendency of a dispute, nor its consideration by the committee will excuse CONSULTANT from full and timely performance in accordance with the terms of this contract.

ARTICLE XXIII INSPECTION OF WORK

CONSULTANT and any subconsultant shall permit LOCAL AGENCY, the state, and the FHWA if federal participating funds are used in this contract; to review and inspect the project activities and files at all reasonable times during the performance period of this contract including review and inspection on a daily basis.

ARTICLE XXIV SAFETY

- A. CONSULTANT shall comply with OSHA regulations applicable to CONSULTANT regarding necessary safety equipment or procedures. CONSULTANT shall comply with safety instructions issued by LOCAL AGENCY Safety Officer and other LOCAL AGENCY representatives. CONSULTANT personnel shall wear hard hats and safety vests at all times while working on the construction project site.
- B. Pursuant to the authority contained in Section 591 of the Vehicle Code, LOCAL AGENCY has determined that such areas are within the limits of the project and are open to public traffic. CONSULTANT shall comply with all of the requirements set forth in Divisions 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15 of the Vehicle Code. CONSULTANT shall take all reasonably necessary precautions for safe operation of its vehicles and the protection of the traveling public from injury and damage from such vehicles.
- C. Any subcontract entered into as a result of this contract, shall contain all of the provisions of this Article.
- D. CONSULTANT must have a Division of Occupational Safety and Health (CAL-OSHA) permit(s), as outlined in California Labor Code Sections 6500 and 6705, prior to the initiation of any practices, work, method, operation, or process related to the construction or excavation of trenches which are five feet or deeper.

ARTICLE XXV INSURANCE

- A. Prior to commencement of the work described herein, CONSULTANT shall furnish LOCAL AGENCY a Certificate of Insurance stating that there is general comprehensive liability insurance presently in effect for CONSULTANT with a combined single limit (CSL) of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence.
- B. The Certificate of Insurance will provide:
 - 1. That the insurer will not cancel the insured's coverage without 30 days prior written notice to LOCAL AGENCY.
 - 2. That LOCAL AGENCY, its officers, agents, employees, and servants are included as additional insureds, but only insofar as the operations under this contract are concerned.
 - 3. That LOCAL AGENCY will not be responsible for any premiums or assessments on the policy.
- C. CONSULTANT agrees that the bodily injury liability insurance herein provided for, shall be in effect at all times during the term of this contract. In the event said insurance coverage expires at any time or times during the term of this contract, CONSULTANT agrees to provide at least thirty (30) days prior notice to said expiration date; and a new Certificate of Insurance evidencing insurance coverage as provided for herein, for not less than either the remainder of the term of the contract, or for a period of not less than one (1) year. New Certificates of Insurance are subject to the approval of LOCAL AGENCY. In the event CONSULTANT fails to keep in effect at all times insurance coverage as herein provided, LOCAL AGENCY may, in addition to any other remedies it may have, terminate this contract upon occurrence of such event.

ARTICLE XXVI OWNERSHIP OF DATA

A. Upon completion of all work under this contract, ownership and title to all reports, documents, plans, specifications, and estimates produce as part of this contract will automatically be vested in LOCAL AGENCY; and no further agreement will be necessary to transfer ownership to LOCAL AGENCY.

- CONSULTANT shall furnish LOCAL AGENCY all necessary copies of data needed to complete the review and approval process.
- B. It is understood and agreed that all calculations, drawings and specifications, whether in hard copy or machine-readable form, are intended for one-time use in the construction of the project for which this contract has been entered into.
- C. CONSULTANT is not liable for claims, liabilities, or losses arising out of, or connected with the modification, or misuse by LOCAL AGENCY of the machine-readable information and data provided by CONSULTANT under this contract; further, CONSULTANT is not liable for claims, liabilities, or losses arising out of, or connected with any use by LOCAL AGENCY of the project documentation on other projects for additions to this project, or for the completion of this project by others, except only such use as many be authorized in writing by CONSULTANT.
- D. Applicable patent rights provisions regarding rights to inventions shall be included in the contracts as appropriate (48 CFR 27, Subpart 27.3 Patent Rights under Government Contracts for federal-aid contracts).
- E. LOCAL AGENCY may permit copyrighting reports or other agreement products. If copyrights are permitted; the agreement shall provide that the FHWA shall have the royalty-free nonexclusive and irrevocable right to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use; and to authorize others to use, the work for government purposes.
- F. Any subcontract in excess of \$25,000 entered into as a result of this contract, shall contain all of the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XXVII CLAIMS FILED BY LOCAL AGENCY'S CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTOR

- A. If claims are filed by LOCAL AGENCY's construction contractor relating to work performed by CONSULTANT's personnel, and additional information or assistance from CONSULTANT's personnel is required in order to evaluate or defend against such claims; CONSULTANT agrees to make its personnel available for consultation with LOCAL AGENCY'S construction contract administration and legal staffand for testimony, if necessary, at depositions and at trial or arbitration proceedings.
- B. CONSULTANT's personnel that LOCAL AGENCY considers essential to assist in defending against construction contractor claims will be made available on reasonable notice from LOCAL AGENCY. Consultation or testimony will be reimbursed at the same rates, including travel costs that are being paid for CONSULTANT's personnel services under this contract.
- C. Services of CONSULTANT's personnel in connection with LOCAL AGENCY's construction contractor claims will be performed pursuant to a written contract amendment, if necessary, extending the termination date of this contract in order to resolve the construction claims.
- D. Any subcontract in excess of \$25,000 entered into as a result of this contract, shall contain all of the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XXVIII CONFIDENTIALITY OF DATA

- A. All financial, statistical, personal, technical, or other data and information relative to LOCAL AGENCY's operations, which are designated confidential by LOCAL AGENCY and made available to CONSULTANT in order to carry out this contract, shall be protected by CONSULTANT from unauthorized use and disclosure.
- B. Permission to disclose information on one occasion, or public hearing held by LOCAL AGENCY relating to the contract, shall not authorize CONSULTANT to further disclose such information, or disseminate the same on any other occasion.
- C. CONSULTANT shall not comment publicly to the press or any other media regarding the contract or LOCAL AGENCY's actions on the same, except to LOCAL AGENCY's staff, CONSULTANT's own personnel involved in the performance of this contract, at public hearings or in response to questions from a Legislative

committee.

- D. CONSULTANT shall not issue any news release or public relations item of any nature, whatsoever, regarding work performed or to be performed under this contract without prior review of the contents thereof by LOCAL AGENCY, and receipt of LOCAL AGENCY'S written permission.
- E. Any subcontract entered into as a result of this contract shall contain all of the provisions of this Article.
- F. All information related to the construction estimate is confidential, and shall not be disclosed by CONSULTANT to any entity other than LOCAL AGENCY.

ARTICLE XXIX NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD CERTIFICATION

In accordance with Public Contract Code Section 10296, CONSULTANT hereby states under penalty of perjury that no more than one final unappealable finding of contempt of court by a federal court has been issued against CONSULTANT within the immediately preceding two-year period, because of CONSULTANT's failure to comply with an order of a federal court that orders CONSULTANT to comply with an order of the National Labor Relations Board.

ARTICLE XXX EVALUATION OF CONSULTANT

CONSULTANT's performance will be evaluated by LOCAL AGENCY. A copy of the evaluation will be sent to CONSULTANT for comments. The evaluation together with the comments shall be retained as part of the contract record.

ARTICLE XXXI RETENTION OF FUNDS

- A. Any subcontract entered into as a result of this Contract shall contain all of the provisions of this section.
- B. No retainage will be withheld by the Agency from progress payments due the prime consultant. Retainage by the prime consultant or subconsultants is prohibited, and no retainage will be held by the prime consultant from progress due subconsultants. Any violation of this provision shall subject the violating prime consultant or subconsultants to the penalties, sanctions, and other remedies specified in Section 7108.5 of the California Business and Professions Code. This requirement shall not be construed to limit or impair any contractual, administrative, or judicial remedies, otherwise available to the prime consultant or subconsultant in the event of a dispute involving late payment or nonpayment by the prime consultant or deficient subconsultant performance, or noncompliance by a subconsultant. This provision applies to both DBE and non-DBE prime consultants and subconsultants.

ARTICLE XXXII NOTIFICATION

All notices hereunder and communications regarding interpretation of the terms of this contract and changes thereto, shall be effected by the mailing thereof by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and addressed as follows:


